

**PROGRAMME STRUCTURE 2015-20**

1. **OBJECTIVE** The close connection between social sciences and law hardly needs to be articulated. A lawyer needs to be conscious of the intricate and complex problems of the society. Our integrated Bachelor of Law programme provides a deep insight into the historical perspective of development of law, political factors influencing policies culminating into law and the intricate relationship between legislations and social problems. This programme aims at creating socially sensitive sentinels of justice.
2. **DURATION** Five Years Full Time
3. **INTAKE** 180 Students
4. **RESERVATION**

I. Within the sanctioned intake:

  - a) Scheduled Castes-15%
  - b) Scheduled Tribes-7.5%
  - c) Differently abled-3%
  - d) Wards of Serving/Retired Defence Personnel - 5%

II. Over and above the sanctioned intake:

  - a) Kashmiri Migrants - 2 Seats
  - b) International Students - 15%
5. **ELIGIBILITY** The candidate should have passed 12th (10+2) examination from any recognized board with minimum 45% marks (40% for S.C. /S.T. students) in one attempt (No Compartment). Students who have appeared for their H.S.C. finals and awaiting results are also eligible to apply, subject to submission of passing certificate by the announced date. Applicants who have obtained 10+2 through Open Universities system directly without having any basic qualification are not eligible for the law programme.  
**Age Limit:** Candidate should be less than 20 years of age at the time of appearing for SET as in May 2015. (2 years relaxation for SC/ST candidates i.e. 22 years)
6. **SELECTION PROCEDURE** Symbiosis Entrance Test (SET) followed by Personal Interaction and Writing Ability Test of the short listed candidates. Final selection shall be based on the combined merit list of SET score (50%) and PI-WAT (50%)
7. **MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION** English

- 11. ASSESSMENT** All internal courses will have 100% component as internal evaluation at the institute level. All external courses will have 40% internal component and 60% external component [University] examination.
- Internal and external heads of passing shall be separate head of passing. Internal evaluation shall consist of one project (20 marks) and minimum 2 of the following (10 marks each): Tutorial, case analysis, cases and open problems, essays, seminar presentations, viva-voce, quiz, drafting, moot court, mock trial, learning logs/diaries, computer based assessment, simulated interviews, objective structured clinical examinations.
- 12. STANDARD OF PASSING** The assessment of the student for each examination is done, based on relative performance. Maximum Grade Point (GP) is 10 corresponding to O (outstanding). For all courses, a student is required to pass both internal and external examination separately with a minimum Grade Point of 4 corresponding to Grade P. Students securing less than 40% absolute marks in each head of passing will be declared FAIL. The University awards a degree to the student who has achieved a minimum CGPA of 4 out of maximum of 10 CGPA for the programme.
- 13. AWARD OF DEGREE** **Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws (Honours) BALLB (Hons)** will be awarded at the end of semester X by taking into consideration the performance of all semester examinations after obtaining minimum 4.00 CGPA out of 10 CGPA.

Programme Structure is approved by the Academic Council and the Board of Management subject to its norms & conditions. Any provision in the Programme Structure which violates the basic rules & regulations is deemed to be termed "Null & Void".
