- 1. OBJECTIVE** This programme is designed in view of spreading legal knowledge among professionals from other disciplines in the society. Its objective is to impart legal education to the students from various backgrounds and equip them to perform various roles of a professional lawyer beyond the traditional role of litigation. The students will gain knowledge and develop advocacy skills which will help them in achieving their goals & objectives and serve the society.
- 2. DURATION** Three Years Full Time
- 3. INTAKE** 60 Students
- 4. RESERVATION**
- I. Within the sanctioned intake:
- a) Scheduled Castes-15%
 - b) Scheduled Tribes-7.5%
 - c) Differently abled-3%
 - d) Wards of Serving/Retired Defence Personnel-5%
- II. Over and above the sanctioned intake:
- a) Kashmiri Migrants - 2 Seats
 - b) International Students - 15%
- 5. ELIGIBILITY** A candidate should be a graduate from any recognized / statutory University or Institution of National Importance with a minimum of 45% marks (40% for SC/ST) at graduation. A candidate who has appeared for his/ her final year of graduation examination can apply. However, his/ her admission will be subject to obtaining a minimum of 45% marks (40% for S.C./ S.T.) at graduation. A candidate who has completed qualifying qualification from any Foreign University must obtain an equivalence certificate from Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- 6. SELECTION PROCEDURE** Writing Sample and Personal Interaction of the candidates. Final selection shall be based on the combined merit list of Writing Sample and Personal Interaction.



11. **ASSESSMENT**
- All internal courses will have 100% component as internal evaluation at the institute level. All external courses will have 40% internal component and 60% external component [University] examination.
- Internal and external heads of passing shall be separate head of passing. Internal evaluation shall consist of one project (20 marks) and minimum 2 of the following (10 marks each): Tutorial, case analysis, cases and open problems, essays, seminar presentations, viva-voce, quiz, drafting, moot court, mock trial, learning logs/diaries, computer based assessment, simulated interviews, objective structured clinical examinations.
12. **STANDARD OF PASSING**
- The assessment of the student for each examination is done, based on relative performance. Maximum Grade Point (GP) is 10 corresponding to O (outstanding). For all courses, a student is required to pass both internal and external examination separately with a minimum Grade Point of 4 corresponding to Grade P. Students securing less than 40% absolute marks in each head of passing will be declared FAIL. The University awards a degree to the student who has achieved a minimum

CGPA of 4 out of maximum of 10 CGPA for the programme.

13. AWARD OF DEGREE

Bachelor of Laws will be awarded at the end of semester VI by taking into consideration the performance of all semester examinations after obtaining minimum 4.00 CGPA out of 10 CGPA.

Programme Structure is approved by the Academic Council subject to its norms & conditions. Any provision in the Programme Structure which violates the basic rules & regulations is deemed to be termed "Null & Void".

Semester VI

1 This course will be conducted through class instructions and simulation exercises, in association with practicing lawyers. Evaluation will include written test (80 marks), case study (20 marks),. Viva voce examination will be conducted by a panel consisting of internal and external members (appointed by the Symbiosis International University).

2The course will be taught class instructions and simulation exercises, preferably with assistance of practicing lawyers/retired judges. Apart from teaching the relevant provisions of law, the course may include not less than 15 practical exercises in drafting carrying a total of 45 marks (3 marks each) and 15 exercises in Conveyancing carrying another 45marks (3 marks each) remaining 30 marks will be given for viva voce. Viva voce examination will be conducted by a panel consisting of internal and external members (appointed by the Symbiosis International University).

3 The course will be conducted by senior legal practitioners through simulation and case studies. Evaluation will be conducted in practical exercises and case studies for 80 marks and viva voce for 20 marks. Viva voce examination will be conducted by a panel consisting of internal and external members

Interviewing techniques and Pre-trial preparations and as per the given format, cumulative Internship diary (30 marks). Each student will further observe the preparation of documents and court papers by the Advocate and the procedure for the filing of the suit/petition. This will be recorded in a separate diary. In addition to the above three components, the fourth component will be Viva Voce examination on all the above three aspects (10 marks). Viva voce examination will be conducted by a panel consisting of internal and external members (appointed by the Symbiosis International University).
